West Nile Virus Update: The Health Department confirms the presence of West Nile Virus in Fairfax County. Therefore, crows are no longer tested by the County. If you have a dead bird/crow on your property, please dispose of it yourself. Carefully avoid physical contact with the bird by wearing gloves, deposit the crow in a plastic bag, and place in trash. Until the onset of winter we must continue to take preventive measures to eliminate mosquitoes from our neighborhoods. It takes as little as one week for Mosquitoes to hatch in only a few spoonfuls of water. Practice the "TIP & Toss method." Check roof gutters, discarded cans & containers, old tires, bird baths, wading pools, drainage ditches, canoes /boats, tarps, ornamental ponds, puddles & swampy areas, and other miscellaneous items such as toys, wheelbarrows, etc. For further information, contact the Fairfax County Health Department at 703-246-2300 or website: www.co.fairfax.va.us/service/hd.
